What time should I arrive?

Our regular Sunday sermons begin at 10:30 a.m., either in person or on Zoom. You can find the Zoom link and passcode on our homepage or worship page.

How long is the service?

We aim for services that last about an hour, with plenty of time to hang out and connect afterward.

Do I need to dress a certain way?

Absolutely not! Come as you are. Our vibe is casual, but some people like to dress up too—whatever makes you feel comfortable is great.

Is there parking available?

Yes. Park in our main lot or there is overflow on the back side of the Senior Housing facility. Just please be sure not to park in their designated lot.

What happens during a typical service?

We start with hymns—no pressure to sing, and the words are on screen and in books. While we sing, candles are lit at the front.

Children are invited up for a short story before heading to Sunday School.

Next, we share prayer requests and the pastor leads a group prayer. Then comes the sermon, with scripture and a message.

We close by gathering at the front, joining hands, and singing a simple shalom song (easy to learn, no pressure to join in). After a closing prayer, we enjoy coffee, snacks, and conversation in the lobby.

Do I need to bring anything?

Nope! Just bring yourself—your kids, your babies, your friends, your grandma—everyone's welcome in our space. Really.

About giving

We don't pass an offering plate during the service. If you feel led to give, there's a small box on a table at the back of the sanctuary where you can drop in cash or checks. We only collect a formal offering on communion Sundays—but please know, there's no expectation to give, ever.
